

Norwegian Artistic Research Programme (NARP)

Call for applications

The *Norwegian Artistic Research Programme* has national responsibility for promoting and stimulating artistic research in Norway. We hereby invite you to submit your application.

1 Who can apply?

All accredited Norwegian institution of higher education may apply for project funding. The application may include other partners, provided that the Norwegian applicant is the project owner.

A specific project manager must be identified by the applicant institution. This person must have qualifications equivalent to that of an associate professor and must be employed by the applicant institution in at least a 50% position during the project implementation.

2 What can applicants apply for?

The programme funds projects in which artistic practice is at the core of the activities. The relationship between artists, artistic results, public arenas for presentation of these results and open access publications are therefore of significant value. Consequently, the production of works of art directed towards public concerts, performances and exhibitions must be included in the project, as well as descriptions of how project results will be presented in international peer reviewed publication channels. Further requirements are given in Guidelines to applicants. Guidelines for the applicants are available at artistic-research.no

The establishment of institutional PhD degrees and the national research school in creative and performing arts represent a sought-after and major restructuring of the programme. Resources for research fellow positions are available and may be included in the project application. Individual researchers or students may not apply for such resources. There are 3 research fellows positions available for applicants in 2019. Research Fellows financed by NARP must participate in a PhD programme in artistic research at a Norwegian institution of higher education.

Submitted applications may include research fellow positions.

3 Application deadline

Application deadline is October 15th, 2018 at 12AM (noon). Decision on allocations can be expected around March 1st, 2019.
