Project development and the reflections

Objective: Presenting status of project development and material that express and document the reflection at the start of the fourth semester.

Learning outcomes: The research fellow can articulate/describe the challenges and qualities of his/her own project within a limited timeline. When meeting others, the research fellow can address questions that contribute to the development and discussion of projects. The research fellow can identify the project's main phases and manage complex artistic projects.

Seminar work methods: There will be two presentations for each fellow

- a *brief status and progress presentation* on day one (10 minutes)
- an *extensive group workshop*

The brief status and project presentation: The research fellows present how their projects are developing as well as expedient formats for presentation, both for the artistic results and for documentation of reflections.

The group workshops are more open: Groups of 4 research fellows work together, with the aim of strengthening a particular aspect in each of the fellows' project. Each fellow will lead the group for a session of 75 minutes. During this session the fellow bring forward a particular challenge or aspect of his/her project inviting the group to respond. The format and length of this presentation is up to the fellow. The group works together on developing this aspect, moderated by the fellow. The same groups are kept for all workshop sessions.

You are free to choose the topics for your own session. The following questions are suggestions to questions that can be addressed: Is the project developing the way you expected it to – if not, will the unexpected turns significantly change your project? Do the turns represent problems, or do they add new values? What are the key challenges? Are your planned formats of presentation and dissemination still adequate, or do you need to modify or change them? What do you expect will be the main criticism of your assessment committee?

The workshop is a good opportunity to discuss your project with other fellows extensively. We strongly suggest that you invite your group to take part in a discussion, rather than presenting your project for 75 minutes.
